1. How will the LEA, to the greatest extent practicable, support prevention and mitigation policies in line with the most up-to-date guidance from the CDC for the reopening and operation of school facilities in order to continuously and safely open and operate schools for in-person learning?

Cleaning and sanitizing procedures remain largely unchanged. All district buildings will be cleaned thoroughly by trained custodial staff at least once daily. High-touch surfaces including desks, tables, chairs and doorknobs will be cleaned more frequently throughout the day, and teachers and staff will have disinfectant wipes on hand for use as needed.

Custodial training and quality control programs were implemented prior to the 2020-21 school year and will continue to ensure all areas are cleaned and disinfected to the standard necessary to maintain a safe and healthy school environment.

NORTH HILLS SCHOOL DISTRICT will keep students and staff socially distant to the extent possible. Unnecessary classroom furniture removed last school year will not be brought back into spaces where adequate physical distancing cannot be maintained. Student desks and seats will remain separated no less than three feet to the extent possible and facing the same direction. Outdoor spaces will be utilized whenever possible.

Handwashing and good hygiene will continue to be reinforced. Resources developed by school nurses during the summer of 2020 will be shared with students as they return this school year and then periodically as the year progresses. Signage remains in all buildings as do additional hand washing and sanitizing stations added to classrooms and common spaces prior to the 2020-21 school year.

The health and safety of our students and staff is an ongoing responsibility shared by all. The NORTH HILLS SCHOOL DISTRICT community will be continuously reminded to be diligent about their health and the health of those around them, i.e. if you are sick, please stay home. Continuing a community-wide effort will ensure our schools can safely reopen for in-person instruction and remain open during the 2022-23 school year.

2. How will the LEA ensure continuity of services, including but not limited to services to address the students' academic needs, and students' and staff members' social, emotional, mental health, and other needs, which may include student health and food services?

All students (K-12) receive a district-issued iPad for use at school and at home. All students have a North Hills School District email address and Google account which they use to access Google Classrooms created and run by all North Hills School District teachers.

North Hills School District hired two new school student assistant counselors for the 2022-23 school year, one of whom will focus exclusively on student mental health needs. North Hills School District now has five school student assistant counselors supporting the social, emotional and mental health needs of our 4,700 students.

Our counseling department will continue the development of groups formed during the pandemic focusing on student mental health needs. Our student-led Stand Together club will continue its work to stop the stigma that often surrounds mental health issues through education and awareness.

North Hills School District will also continue its participation in suicide prevention programs and host mental health events, forums and webinars. Our partnerships with outside counseling agencies including Glade Run Lutheran Services and Holy Family Institute will continue.

a. <u>Universal and correct wearing of masks;</u>	Masks are optional for the 2022-23 school year in all school buildings unless otherwise directed by the Superintendent or directed by School Board Action.
b. <u>Modifying facilities to allow for physical distancing</u> (e.g., use of cohorts/podding);	Unless otherwise authorized by the Superintendent, unnecessary items and furniture have been removed from classrooms and instructional spaces to accommodate physical distancing to the greatest extent possible. Student desks and seats will be separated and facing the same direction allowing for a minimum distance of no less than three feet to the extent possible. Outdoor spaces will be utilized whenever possible.
c. <u>Handwashing and respiratory etiquette;</u>	School nurses will reinforce resources regarding good hygiene practices and handwashing techniques with staff, students and parents. Additionally, CDC recommended signage will remain throughout our buildings. These best

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	<p>practices include but are not limited to washing hands multiple times a day for at least 20 seconds with soap and water or using an alcohol-based hand sanitizer; covering coughs or sneezes with your elbow or using a tissue; avoiding touching your eyes, nose and mouth with unwashed hands; encouraging fist and elbow pumps over handshakes and high-fives, not sharing food or drink; and staying home if you are sick and for at least 24 hours after a fever.</p>
<p>d. <u>Cleaning</u> and maintaining healthy facilities, including improving <u>ventilation</u>;</p>	<p>All North Hills School District buildings will continue to be cleaned at least once daily by trained custodial staff using hospital grade disinfectant chemicals that are classified as such by the Environmental Protection Agency. The custodial supervisor in each building operates a quality control program to ensure areas are cleaned and disinfected to a standard necessary to maintain a safe and healthy school environment.</p> <p>In all of our buildings, ventilation rates are set at the American Society of Heating, Refrigerating, and Air Conditioning Engineers’ design standard and these rates are increased when students are in attendance.</p> <p>Additionally, in 2020-21, North Hills School District installed needlepoint ionization in all ventilation units to combat viruses and bacteria in air circulation.</p> <p>School buses will be cleaned and sanitized twice daily after both morning and afternoon routes.</p>
<p>e. <u>Contact tracing</u> in combination with <u>isolation</u> and <u>quarantine</u>, in collaboration with the State and local health departments;</p>	<p>North Hills School District will not contact trace or identify close contacts of positive covid cases and will not require healthy students to isolate or quarantine due to close contact of a COVID case.</p> <p>North Hills School District will not track or count COVID cases during the 2022-23 school year.</p>
<p>f. <u>Diagnostic</u> and screening testing;</p>	<p>North Hills School District will participate in a diagnostic and screening testing program provided by the Pennsylvania Department of Health if it is free and noninvasive. Students will not be tested without the authorization of the Superintendent and consent of the parent.</p>

Efforts to provide <u>vaccinations to school communities</u>;</p>	<p>North Hills School District partnered with local pharmacy Giant Eagle to provide vaccinations to students as well as community members. As of Aug. 1, 2022, we will have offered five clinics as a school district. We will continue to offer vaccines through Giant Eagle as the availability and need is warranted.</p>

Appropriate accommodations for students with disabilities with respect to health and safety policies; and</p>	<p>North Hills School District continues to follow all policies for all students and will develop appropriate individualized health and safety plans for any student who requires special accommodations as documented in their IEP/504.</p>
<p>i. Coordination with state and local health officials.</p>	<p>North Hills School District administrators and school nursing staff will work with Allegheny County Health Department officials as needed. The district will take advice from the county health department, but the superintendent will make the final determination on isolation and quarantine of students and staff and will make a final determination in consultation with the Board on masking, class closure, and school closure.</p>


